

May 2, 2023 Bond Proposal

Infrastructure and newly configured secure entry with new administrative offices, remodeled media center and cafeteria upgrades, remodel of visual arts labs, the addition of space for collaborative, hands-on learning, and construction of a fieldhouse.

- Outdoor learning spaces, technology, buses, and acquiring adjacent property to expand and upgrade the HS building and campus are also included.
- \$49.8 million bond proposal with NO PROJECTED INCREASE to the current bond millage rate.

Dear Spring Lake Community,

The Spring Lake community has a long history of supporting its school system and thereby assuring that educational excellence remains a top

priority. Whether you measure our outcomes by student achievement, extracurricular performance, or the relationships SLPS staff foster with their students, the results validate that the partnership between community and school district is a successful one in Spring Lake.

This brochure focuses on the upcoming School Bond proposal that will appear on your May 2nd election ballot. The research behind this bond was extensive and involved community members, staff, and facility experts. Their efforts drove discussion about improvements to safety, programming, student engagement, and infrastructure. In January, the SLPS Board of Education voted unanimously to approve this group's recommendation and place a \$49.8 million proposal on the May ballot.

If approved by voters, the May 2023 Bond will provide a safe & secure entry vestibule to Spring Lake High School; a new commons area that is open and welcoming to students, staff, and visitors; classroom additions, remodels, and upgrades that assure we are preparing students for future success; and, new and improved spaces for artists, performers, and athletes. These improvements come with no projected increase to our debt millage.

Key Features of Bond 2023

Spring Lake High School

- New Secure Entry and Administration space
- Add 4 new classrooms and common space
- Remodel/add Visual Arts space supporting hands-on learning
- Media Center upgrades with spaces for collaboration
- Secure classrooms with new door hardware and window film
- New Outdoor Learning spaces
- Athletic upgrades including new tennis courts, addition of varsity baseball field and fieldhouse
- Upgrade fire alarm and security camera system
- Instructional technology for students & staff





When would Bond 2023 improvements occur?

If approved by voters, design work would commence immediately, followed by construction anticipated to occur between Spring 2024 and Fall 2027.

Is the bond millage rate estimated to be the same for the entire life of the bond proposal?

No, the bond millage rate is estimated to remain at the current rate of 7.00 mills through 2032, thereafter it is estimated to decline due to bond repayment and taxable value growth.

How was this plan developed?

TMP Architecture and O-A-K Construction conduct Facility Condition and Program Assessments of all District buildings to identify infrastructure and program deficiencies.

The Bond Study Committee (BSC), a group of 35 community members, was charged with developing a plan for upgrading educational & extracurricular facilities to support flexible, student-centered educational spaces.

The BSC met from August through November to begin analyzing concepts & ideas while considering assessment report findings and the financial picture regarding SLPS bond programs.

Frequently Asked Questions

A community survey was conducted to gain broader feedback and consensus about the bond program direction. A recommendation was prepared and presented to the BOE for consideration on Nov 21, 2022.

On Jan 23, 2023, the BOE approved a May 2, 2023 Bond Proposal for \$49.8 million, which represents an expected ZERO mill increase to the current bond millage rate.
