- Is not carved in stone! It will change as your interests and goals change.
- Will be revised and updated annually.

FINAL FORMS

All students who plan to participate in a sport must be compliant in the online platform Final Forms before practices start. This includes completing a sports physical. Physical forms may be picked up the Athletic Office, High School Office, Middle School Office and Superintendent's Office.

Note: Physicals after April 15 are good for the next year. Also, there is a one time \$75 player fee that covers the entire school year.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

How do you know students will choose the correct classes?

Students will receive scheduling material at their meeting Monday, February 26th. They should complete a four-year plan with the assistance of parents. Current SL 8th grade students should bring these forms to school on February 29th. On February 29, counselors will help students enter their requests into PowerSchool. Those not currently attending SLMS and are Spring Lake School District residents need to complete the online enrollment application and return their form, to the high school by March 1st. Please note that these are requests only. Requests will determine a master schedule, after which student schedules will be created.

What if my child is advanced in a particular subject? Can he/she sign up for a higher level class?

Mastery of specific content must be demonstrated before 9th grade students are permitted to advance. Testing out of a course is also required. Please make an appointment with a high school counselor to make this determination.

What if my child has a different teacher for the second part of a class? For example: Smith for English 9A and Moore for English 9B?

Occasionally, factors like class availability, section numbers, and class sizes do not allow teacher consistency.

Will my student get everything on his/her schedule that is requested? What if he/she doesn't?

Students will get the required classes for each grade. Some students will not get all of their elective choices.

How will students know which lunch they are assigned?

Your child's third hour teacher will be assigned either lunch 1 or lunch 2. This will be your child's lunch time as well.

What if I want to request a teacher for my child?

We do not accept teacher requests at the high school.

My child is coming from a small private school and is very nervous about the transition. Will there be an opportunity for her/him to meet with a counselor and tour the school prior to September (besides Smart Start)?

Call the Counseling Office at 846-5505 to have a conversation or set up an appointment.

When will my child receive his/her schedule for next year?

Your student will receive his/her 9th grade schedule at the student orientation, Smart Start, in August.

Do I need to do anything in order to continue receiving email progress reports once my child begins 9th grade?

If your child is currently an 8th grade student at SLMS, the student's information remains the same and you will begin receiving reports probably a couple weeks after school begins. Please call the high school counseling office if you need to make changes. If your child is new to our district, please contact the counseling office to receive the parent access information to set up an account on PowerSchool.
